41% of learners made expected progress or above in SPAG (compared to 33% in the previous academic year)

LAC Pupil Premium = £6,032 received

How this was spent: Additional Teaching Assistant on site to support LAC children 1:1 for 3 days per week.

Impact: Children who would have otherwise struggled to engage with school were accessing full-time provision, with one child being able to return to mainstream for the following academic year.

2018-19 Academic Year

Pupil premium funded an additional TA to work 1:1 with the children in greatest need of support to enable the class teacher and class TA to support the rest of the cohort appropriately.

How this was spent:

ICT equipment for our LAC to close gaps in Literacy and Numeracy.

PE and Sports Grant = £16,280 received

How this was spent:

Project work with The Saints to enable all children a wider range of experiences in sport.

Impact:

63% of learners made expected progress or above in Reading (compared to 59% in the previous academic year)

61% of learners made expected progress or above in Writing (compared to 50% in the previous academic year)

70% of learners made expected progress or above in Maths (compared to 62% in the previous academic year)
